
#### How you got into reining?-

### The following are the NRHA Green Reiner Conditions

#### CLASSIC EQUINE GREEN REINER SHOW CONDITIONS

- Youth, Non Pro or Associate NRHA membership required (\$40 USD)
- Associate members do not need Non Pro status but must be eligible to obtain it
- Ownership requirements do not apply
- Competition licences not required
- A Green Reiner class must be held in conjunction with an NRHA ancillary show.
- Use NRHA patterns 1-13
- · The rider can choose to ride with one or two hands
- The rider can choose to perform either simple or flying lead changes
- Standard NRHA rules for legal bits and attire (long sleeve shirt, hat/helmet, boots, western saddle and western bridle
- Green Reiner Level 1 Open to riders who have less than \$200 in NRHA earnings, have less than 75 NRHA Youth points and have less than 200 Green Reiner points
- Green Reiner Level 2 Open to riders who have less than \$350 in NRHA earnings have less than 175 NRHA Youth points and less than 350 Green Reiner points

## GREEN REINER POINTS WILL BE AWARDED ACCORDING TO THE NRHA GREEN POINT SCALE

- (a) Number of horses to be used for computation shall be those horses actually competing; excluding the number of horses entered but scratched from competition. There is no cap on the number of points able to be earned in any one class.
- (b) Neither a no score nor a 0 are eligible to receive points in a green reiner class; however this does not alter the scale of points for placing
- (c) For example: If 20 horses compete in Green Reiner 1, 1<sup>st</sup> will receive 20 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> will receive 19 points, 3<sup>rd</sup> will receive 18 points, etc.
